Emergency Management Unit (EMU)

Goals

The EMU team consists of team members from Centennial and Hastings Manor. The goals of the EMU team are to ensure that all emergency codes and drills are completed annually to better train the team members in each home. Drills can be tabletop exercises or acted out scenarios.

What we do

The EMU team plans and prepares for all types of emergencies. From Extreme Weather events such as tornados or floods to Code Yellow for a missing person, we train and practice to ensure all team members know their role in such an emergency.



Safety First

The EMU team reviews policies to ensure all team members, residents and visitors know what to do in each emergency situation. After each exercise the EMU team reviews specific policies to make sure they are up to date and accessible in the situation. If changes are required, the EMU team will complete these and update the policy.

Vulnerable Occupancy

The EMU team also conducts a yearly evacuation Fire Drill that is observed by the local Fire Department to ensure all evacuations are carried out within a specific timeline. During this drill, residents and team members enact a specific scenario that involves a mock fire location and evacuation to safe zones. This year's Vulnerable Fire Drill will be held in September.

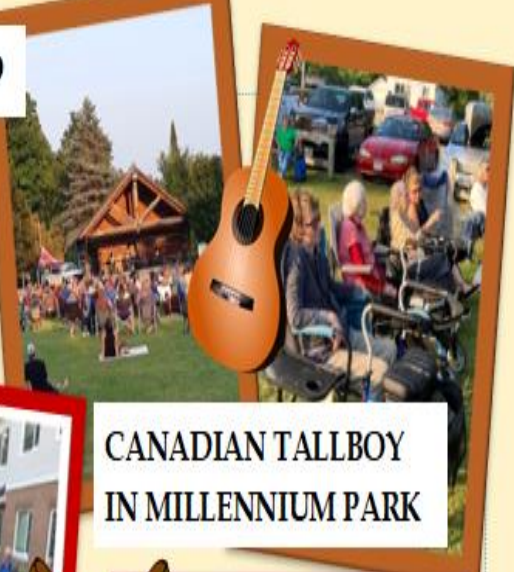

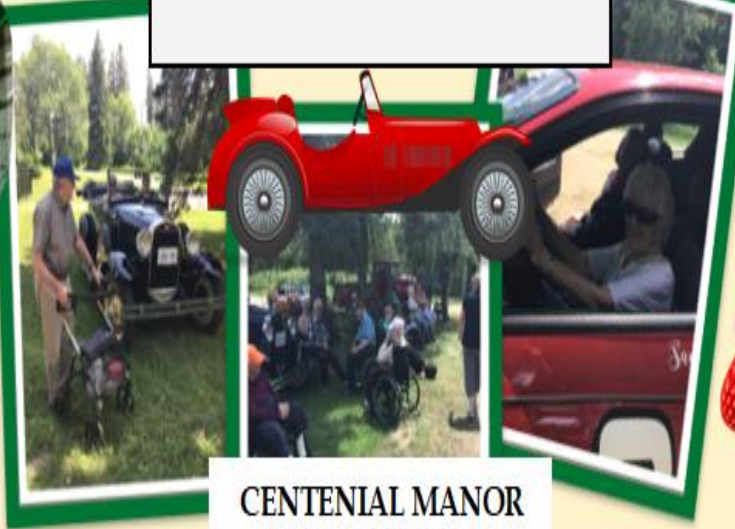
