Invest in Hastings County! Being the second largest County in Ontario with an area of 5,964.5 km², the County stretches from the beautiful Bay of Quinte up north to Algonquin Park. Tap in to an existing market that offers tourists an array of attractions with an abundance of lakes and rivers, rugged outdoor trails and main street shops and boutiques including:

- Bancroft, the "Mineral Capital of Canada" because of the great variety of mineral specimens and rock collecting
- A recreational trail system stretching more than 200 Km
- Numerous heritage attractions such as the O'Hara Mill Homestead, North America's smallest jail house in Tweed and the Hastings County Museum of Agricultural Heritage
- Studio tours and live theatre
- Our cheese factories we are the Cheese Capital of Canada
- Numerous pristine lakes that dot our landscape offering boating and other recreational activities
- Numerous conservation areas and provincial parks such as Algonquin and Lake St. Peter
- A luge track in Bancroft



Location and Transportation

- Hastings County is located halfway between Toronto and Ottawa, served by Canada's largest toll-free Highway 401, Trans Canada Highway #7, and Highways 62, 37, and 28, offering excellent road accessibility
- Passenger rail service is provided by Via Rail Canada. Greyhound Canada Bus Line provides bus transportation to Hastings County with several stops within and around the County. We are just 2 hours east of Pearson International Airport in Toronto. Several registered aerodromes in and around the County offer numerous options for air transportation
